Mussorie

Mussoorie, also known as Queen of the Hills, is among the most popular hill stations of the country. A captivating paradise for leisure travellers and honeymooners, it is a perfect summer resort. Located on a 15-km-long horseshoe ridge with the grand Himalayas as a backdrop, Mussoorie spreads across at a height of 2,000 m above sea level. From this vantage point, it offers scenic views of Himalayas peaks in Western Garhwal.Many famous personalities have made Mussoorie their home — most notable being authors Ruskin Bond and Bill Aitken. Filmstar Victor Banerjee resides in Mussoorie while deceased filmstar Tom Alter was born and brought up here. Situated at a distance of 35 Kms. From Dehradun is a 1 Hrs. Drive.



Rishikesh

The holy city of Rishikesh, in the base of the Himalayas, holds deep cultural and spiritual significance for local Hindus. Sacred rivers and mountains set the scene for yoga and reflective hikes, and rafting here is an absolute must. The Beatles got in touch with their Eastern spiritual side here, writing several songs during a 1968 stint at a local ashram. It is situated 40 kms from Dehradun and is a 1 hour drive.



Haridwar

Haridwar is an ancient city and important Hindu pilgrimage site in North India's Uttarakhand state, where the River Ganges exits the Himalayan foothills. The largest of several sacred ghats (bathing steps), Har Ki Pauri hosts a nightly Ganga Aarti (river-worshipping ceremony) in which tiny flickering lamps are floated off the steps. Worshipers fill the city during major festivals including the annual Kanwar Mela. It is situated 55 Kms. South East of Dehradun and is a 1 hour drive.



Forest Research Institute, Dehradun

The Forest Research Institute in Dehradun is an educational cum tourist spot set amidst the lush green mountains of the lesser siwalik range. The ambience here explodes of intricate beauty and natural diversity. This premier research institute is also the oldest research institute of the country. The place is dedicated for studying the plants, animals, climate and topography of the Himalayan forests. It is one of the prestigious institutes of India and the primary one dedicated singularly to the field of forestry. Constructed on the lines of Greco-roman architectural, this 5-km area campus is home to different varieties of trees, plants and animals – specially a wide range of migratory birds. This architectural gem dates back to the colonial era and has been established in 1906 by the British government.



About the Conference

Uttarakhand, a jewel of Indian Himalayan region, has gained a distinct and significant status in India since its formation. The development of the state over the years has remained lopsided. There is huge disparity in the distribution of economic growth and only few districts of Dehradun, Haridwar and Udham-Singh Nagar have been doing better than the rest of the state. Connectivity is poor despite of many rail & road projects. The condition of basic amenities like quality food, drinkable water, health, transportation and sanitation for rural mass is not satisfactory. The state has vast opportunities to exploit in the field of tourism and often compared with Switzerland, it has a long way to go before it achieves its real potential.

The State has abundant natural resources due to hills and forests and diverse flora and fauna. Its agro-clumatic conditions support horti-culture-based industries but the State has failed to generate employment in this sector. There is a lack of intergration of economic growth and social justice. What should be the development strategy for this region? In this backdrop, this conference being organized by Centre for Public Policy, Doon University, would reflect upon the various issues pertinent to the overall economic development of the state.

The conference would enable the organizers to Conceptualize and Develop the Industrial Road Map of Uttarakhand-Policy Dialogue Series through academic collaboration and integration of partners/stakeholders engaged at different levels in diverse field. - Final paper should not exceed 5000 words including the Abstract, body of the text (Introduction, Theory, Methods, Findings, Discussion, Conclusions and Implications), Tables, Figures and References.
- 4. All paper submissions must include a discussion, which addresses the contribution of the author's work specific to the title and main theme of the conference.
- 5. All submissions must be entirely original, not previously published, and must not be under concurrent consideration or scheduled for presentation elsewhere. Plagiarism as per UGC Norms.
- 6. All abstracts and full papers must be submitted at cppdoon@doonuniversity.ac.in
