

#### 1. International Symposium on History of Ideas: Latin American and India in 21st Century

Department of Spanish Studies, School of Languages, Doon University organised a one-day International Symposium on History of Ideas: Latin America and India in 20th Century on May 15, 2021 through a virtual platform. The coordinator of the program was Dr. Mala Shikha, Assistant Professor, Department of Spanish Studies.

The program was inaugurated by Hon'ble VC, Prof Surekha Dangwal. She emphasized on the importance for the intellectual connections in these times where geographical containment is observed due to the pandemic.

The convenor Dr. Mala Skitcher also bighlighted by the need Pop and erstanding the Akand diplain reception in Latin America since the dawn of Modernism till the present times, and to also look into the de-colonial and post colonial experiences of both the cultures in the last century.

There were four distinguished speakers of Hispanic Studies in India and abroad who conducted four technical sessions.

- 1.1 Discussions on internationalism, pink tide and indigenous epistemologies like the idea of Buen Vivir were conducted by Dr. Ash Narain Roy, Director of Institute of Social Sciences, New Delhi.
- 1.2 A session on Octavio Paz's oeuvre on India and drawing connections with his studies on Claude Levi Strauss and Nagarajuna's Madhyamika philiosophy was conducted by Prof. Minni Sawhney, Department of Germanic and Romance Studies, University of Delhi.
- 1.3 An elucidation on the ideas present in the late 19th century Latin America and their role in challenging the prevalent utilitarian ideas of the USA with the support of the Indian presence was done by Prof. Shyama Prasad Ganguly, a retired professor from JNU, New Delhi.
- 1.4 A talk on the political and aesthetic gaze of various Latin American intellectual travellers, with special focus on Julio Cortazar and Juan Sklar from Argentina, was conducted by Dr. Lucia Caminada Rossetti, a tenured professor at the University of Nordeste in Argentina, Latin America.

The program was attended by the 100 participants, both faulty members and students, who registered for the event from various national as well as international institutions from all over the world.

#### 1. A two days' Workshop on Children's Literature

The Department of English, School of Languages organized a 2- day workshop, jointly with Room to Read, on Children's Literature on July 6 and July 7, 2021.

Hon'ble VC, Prof Surekha Dangwal, in her welcome address and an inaugural lecture on Day 1 of the workshop, talked about the importance of Children's Literature and the role it plays in shaping the psychology of children. She discussed the ways in which Children's Literature reflects the cultural values of the family and nation. She particularly mentioned stories like those from lore and popular fiction like the Panchatantra, the Ramayana as well as Champak, Chacha Chaudhary, amongst others, to show that Children's Literature possesses the power to positively shape the character and morality of children.

1.1 Mrs. Alisha Berger, Global publisher at Room to Read gave an enlightening inaugural note on 'Bringing us together: the power of children's literature'. After reading a children's book titled 'Leave me alone' by Vera Brosgol, she discussed the importance of children's literature from an academic perspective. She referred to the ways in which Children's Literature involves the creation of a demand through families and communities. She also elucidated the science of storytelling experiences and how it

- 1.2 Dr Richa Joshi Pandey discussed the importance of literature as a mirror as well as a window for children to negotiate diverse worlds, multicultural encounters and cultural exchange. She stressed on how translational literature incorporates numerous changes in order to suit the desired target audience. Drawing on the problems and challenges associated with defining childhood and Children's Literature, she discussed childhood as a contextually qualified register which is historically contingent and therefore multiple. She discussed children's reading practices/approaches as those that are never simplistic, predictable or pre-determined. Far from it, the child's engagement with the story invites curiosity and questions about different possibilities for learning and different modes of forming powerful cultural connections.
- 1.3 Dr Anto Thomas talked about the radical shift from traditional (patriarchal) to feministic themes and viewpoints in post-colonial Indian Children's Literature as well as the ideas of power-structure and utopia that are instilled in the "socially-constructed" adult-ified readers by the central characters, who act as the hegemonic groups. Having contradicted the global view of Indian childhood as homogenous, Dr. Thomas concluded the session with suggestions to focus on the psychological spectrum that this literature holds. He concluded by saying that progressive women writers would serve as the key catalysts in fulfilling the promise laid out by Children's Literature.
- 1.4 Dr. Usha Mudiganti, Associate Professor at Ambedkar University, enlightened the audience by providing fundamental knowledge about children's literature. She addressed questions like what is children's literature, why it differs from other kinds of literature, and what children actually learn through this branch of study. She provided a list of important things that a person should consider while reading to a child. She also shed light on kind of books that one must read to children. Children should be offered different perspectives on how things change around them in a child-centric manner.
- 1.5 Dr. Priti Joshi, Associate Professor of Lady Irwin College delivered a lecture on 'Children's Literature & Early Literacy.' She offered deep insights on the landmarks, approaches, and processes involved in the reading-learning journey of a child (birth to 8 yrs). She highlighted the role of the caregiver in familiarizing the child with the operational aspects of reading, active listening, communication, and developing phonemic awareness in the subject. She also discussed how literature fosters thinking, imagination, and the sense of self and agency in a young child.
- 1.6 Dr Diti Vyas, a renowned academic in the sphere of children's literature and education spoke on the second day of the workshop as a panelist. She began her discussion by highlighting a crucial fact that India ranks third in the publication of literature written in English. According to Dr Vyas, it is imperative to conserve literature in local languages because when examples from children's literature in regional languages are

She also delineated the significance of a 'hand in hand' approach between literature written in local languages and literature written in English. The role of the State government in the publication and circulation of regional literature was also stressed upon. The other solutions proposed by her included inventing newer ways of reading and interrogating the unqualified generalisations.

- 1.7 Mr. Sakibrata Sen, Program Director at Room to Read, delivered an interesting talk on Children's Literature in a Digital World. He shed light on how one can have the best informative reading experience. He explained that children need to learn to practice thinking in different ways while reading. Discipline and care in reading practices, is key. He also discussed how digital reading can be immensely enriching as a disciplinary tool for initiating the search for an authentic self.
- 1.8 Children book author and artist, Mukesh Nautiyal, discussed the importance of preserving local culture, language, and literature. He talked about the deleterious impact of the prevalent trend that disregards local languages in favour of languages with more market value, highlighting that nearly 220 local languages are on the verge of extinction. As solutions, he proposed the introduction of local languages & literature as part of the higher education curriculum. He recommended the publication of children literature in the regional or the local languages as solutions.
- 1.9 Mr Manohar Chamoli, a renowned teacher and children's book author discussed the importance of local languages, stressing the need to search for a way to preserve the heritage of our local languages so that future generations may continue to benefit from their immense value. He encouraged everyone, especially young children, to make it a part of daily conversations.

The program was attended by students and faculty members.

The coordinator of the program was **Dr. Richa Joshi Pandey**. There was a total of 200 participants who attended the workshop



Day of Hybrid Cultures: Dialogue, Dissent and Contested Legacy of 1492 in Latin America, November 6<sup>th</sup>, 2015

Sailing from Spain, on October 12<sup>th</sup>, 1492 Christopher Columbus reached what we today call Bahamas in the Caribbean Islands. However, till his death in 1506 he believed that the route he sailed through was the sea-route to India and the places he landed and explored were islands near India. And the Spanish-Portuguese colonisers (who, by the way, liked to call themselves conquistadores or conquerars) following him acted as if the land, the peoples and the resources which they claimed to have 'discovered' were only and happily waiting to be occupied and exploited forever. For several generations of Europeans and Americans, Columbus was a hero, an inspiring explorer and adventurer who shaped the history of the modern world and thus 12<sup>th</sup> Oct was celebrated as Columbus Day in the US and as National Day of Spain. The history, however, has shown that the indigenous and mixed-blood communities in Latin America have never shared this absurd and cruel notion of 'discovery' and, instead, have always fought back with their own histories, cultures and expressions.

With this brief note, we have proposed to observe October 12th here at Doon with some events which have now been rescheduled for November 6th. Following are the events planned for the day:

#### About the speaker:

Dr. José Antonio Flores Farfán is professor and researcher at the Center for Research and Higher Studies in Social Anthropology, Mexico and a docorate from University of Amsterdam.

His research interests include applied linguistics, pragmatics, language contact, discourse analysis, the link between language and education and language planning (especially the field of language revitalization). He has worked extensively with endangered languages, generating multimodal materials that allow the reinforcement, empowerment and linguistic and cultural revitalization of threatened languages and cultures. He has coordinated and published more than 30 titles in different indigenous languages of Mexico such as Nahuatl from Alto Balsas, Yucatecan Mayan, ñuu savi, hñähñú, comcaac, among others. He has taught postgraduate courses in these areas of specialization, directing around 30 theses at the bachelor, master and doctorate level. He is currently coordinator of the Language and Culture Laboratory "Víctor Franco Pellotier" of CIESAS; director of Linguapax Latin America; member of the Mexican Academy of Sciences and belongs to the National System of Researchers(level III).
